Hannah Jade Coles, died suddenly on September 24, 2024 in Austin, TX. Hannah was born December 22, 1998 in Claremont, NH, moving to Elizabethton, TN in 2001 with her parents and later Greenville, SC in 2010 and eventually to Austin, TX in 2014. She graduated from the Austin school system in 2015, a full year and a half early. Her early working career was in various food service position until she became a Catering Manager for a local restaurant. 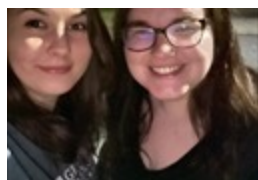

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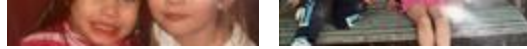
